

Re: Support Small Businesses With a Comprehensive Business Licensing and Permitting Portal

Dear Honorable Members of Chicago's City Council,

On behalf of the undersigned organizations, we write in strong support of Alderman Martin's proposed Order directing the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection (BACP) to develop an implementation plan for a One-Stop Shop Business Licensing and Permitting Portal. This thoughtful proposal represents an important step toward modernizing Chicago's business licensing and permitting system, reducing unnecessary administrative burdens, and making it easier for entrepreneurs to open and grow businesses throughout the City.

Small businesses are the backbone of Chicago's neighborhoods. They create local jobs, foster economic development, strengthen our communities, and contribute to the City's economic vitality. Yet many small businesses are facing an array of challenges, including rising costs, disruptive trade policies, and economic uncertainty. Chicago small businesses also face difficult, time-consuming, and costly processes.

Restaurant owners, for example, may need to use at least three different City portals while coordinating permits, inspections, and licenses. Installing a business sign on the public way requires two separate permit applications and reviews by four City departments. These are only examples of how antiquated and fragmented licensing and permitting processes impact Chicago small businesses. Every day a small business must wait to open its doors because they cannot procure licenses or permits is a day of lost revenue for the business and lost tax revenue for the City.

Alderman Martin's proposed Order will direct the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection (BACP) to formulate an implementation plan for a "One-Stop Shop Business Licensing and Permitting Portal" through which small businesses in Chicago can:

- apply for or renew all licenses, or permits,
- request inspections,
- coordinate directly with City Department liaisons, and
- find personalized information including the status of their permit or license application, the status of their inspection request, and information about inspection requirements.

These reforms can produce meaningful results. Pennsylvania developed a unified business licensing portal that reduced the time required to obtain an initial corporate license from eight weeks to two days. New York City has likewise undertaken efforts to streamline business licensing and permitting to improve outcomes for entrepreneurs.

A comprehensive and coordinated licensing and permitting system will reduce the time and costs of starting or growing a business in Chicago. The proposed portal will support small, local businesses without the resources to navigate difficult and time-consuming processes.

We respectfully urge the Committee on License and Consumer Protection to advance this Order and support Chicago's small business community.
